MAIN IDEA: The stamina of our faith is more important than the size of our faith. Head Change: To know that we lose faith when we forget the miracles God has done in our lives. Heart Change: To celebrate that God is always good and faithful. Life Change: To be intentional about reminding ourselves and others of God's love and power.
